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#### The 3 cornerstones of beginning reading:

1. Letter Knowledge

(Recognition, Naming, Consonants/Vowels)

2. Awareness of Language/Sound Structure

(Words, Syllables, Rimes, Phonemes)

- 3. Text Awareness (concepts of print/language development)
  - Vocabulary Development
  - Background Knowledge

### **Vocabulary Development**

- 1. Baby sign language
- 2. Rich vocabulary daily
- 3. Descriptive language
- 4. Categorization
- 5. Compare and contrast

### **Baby Sign Language**

- 1. Reduces frustration
- 2. Allows babies to express:
  - a. Needs
  - b. Wants
  - c. Feelings
- 3. Improves cognitive and emotional development
- 4. Advances verbal skills
- 5. Improves IQ

\*\*\*When modeling, **always** sign and speak simultaneously!

- 2. Broadens vocabulary
- 3. Improves comprehension
  - a. Read
  - b. Sing
  - c. Recite nursery rhymes and poems
  - d. Play word games
  - e. Ask what and why questions



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#### **Use Rich Vocabulary**

- 1. Daily
- 2. Deliberately
- 3. Purposefully
- 4. Repetitively



### **Building Vocabulary/Sentences Using Descriptive Language**

- 1. Nouns (naming objects)
- 2. Verbs (action words)
- 3. Adjectives (describe the object)
- 4. Adverbs (describe the action)

### Categorize/Sort

Examples:

Toys Colors

Food Shapes

Clothes Birds

Animals Vehicles

Cars Furniture

Flowers Plants

Trees Fruits

Colors Vegetables

#### **Compare and Contrast**

- 1. Comparatives
  - a. Same/Different
  - b. Bigger/smaller
  - c. Longer/shorter
  - d. Nearer/farther
- 2. Superlatives
  - a. Biggest/smallest
  - b. Longest/shortest
  - c. Nearest/farthest
- 3. Positional words
  - a. Above/over/around
  - b. Below/under/beside
  - c. Inside/outside/upside down

#### **Summing Up**

#### Talk, Read, Sing:

- 1. Take every opportunity to expand vocabulary.
- 2. Respond positively to a child's attempts to communicate.
- 3. Allow the child time to reply.
- 4. Have fun when interacting with your child!

\*\*\*Explicit adult modeling and demonstration of the meanings of words are essential in developing a child's oral language.
